#### STEP TEN

## "Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong, promptly admitted it." "Alcoholics the A.A. n

When I first came into the AA I blamed everyone else for my problems. I remember my first 4th step and how it was just a list of "resentments" that I told my sponsor I had already resolved without admitting that I had a part. But something happened to me as I stuck around and kept going to meetings and starting working steps 1-9. Then one day at a book study we were reading and discussing Step 10 and as I heard "every time we are disturbed no matter what the cause is, there is something wrong with me" I had one of those "light bulb" moments where I finally understood what that simple sentence meant. It was a turning point in my recovery. What a relief to know that I don't have to blame you anymore. I can't change you but I can change me if I am willing to look at my part in any situation that arises that disturbs me. As I go through each day sober and try to practice the principles of AA I get a feeling in my gut when something's not right. Sometimes I can see quickly what my part is and resolve the situation immediately. Other times I have to go through a certain amount of pain before I admit my part and absolve you of any blame. Having worked steps 1-9 and doing a few 4<sup>th</sup> step inventories I know that the situations might be different but the nature of my wrongs is ALWAYS the same-Expectations that I place on people, places and things. Today, as I thank my Higher Power each night for another day sober, I can recognize the knot in my gut that tells me I am wrong and I can do whatever is needed to untie that knot. Thank you to my Higher Power, Bill Wilson and Alcoholics Anonymous for Step 10 which gives me a tiny bit of discomfort then a great amount of freedom so that I can continue forward on this amazing journey of Recovery.

### **TRADITION TEN**

"Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy"

Tradition Ten was put into place to protect Alcoholics Anonymous from mistakes of the past. The "Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions" uses the example of the Washingtonian Society. This was a movement started in the 1830's in Baltimore, Maryland. The groups initial focus was to help people stop drinking and achieve permanent sobriety. They had great success in this; there were estimated to be 100,000 sober members. What led to their downfall was getting involved in outside issues. The society branched into the temperance movement; that is, they proposed banning the sale and possession of alcoholic beverages in America. (This did actually happen in 1919, with Prohibition, but 19th century America was not ready for it.) The members of the society were in violent disagreement over this issue, which led to the group breaking apart. A.A. learned from this, and so takes no position on such matters. We choose the sober life; if others want to drink, that is their business. Another group which was part of the foundation of A.A. was the Oxford Group. This Christian reform group had both of A.A.'s co-founders as members. It seems fortunate that the Oxfords decided that drunks were bad for their image. The alcoholic members split off and formed Alcoholics Anonymous. They were able to avoid the disgrace the Oxfords faced a few years later when their founder, Frank Buchman, took a particular liking to Adolf Hitler. A.A. really dodged a bullet on that outside issue. All we care about is carrying the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. The preamble which is read (hopefully) at the start of our meetings is quite clear on this, "A.A. is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution. A.A. does not wish to engage in any controversy, and neither endorses not opposes any causes. So if you are looking for an A.A. endorsement in the Presidential race, forget it.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING: The minutes were read. Reyes-Friday Foundation Group-Come and join us every Friday from 7 pm to 8 pm for a Closed Big Book Study meeting. It is held at the Center for Spiritual Living in Visalia (No meeting the first Friday of every month). Court/Program cards are signed. Learn how members recover and how the AA society functions. Our Speaker for October is Dan M from Bakersfield . Good food and great fellowship. Come and join us! We also need a new treasurer, waitress and the cooks are retiring.

Julie M - Springville Gut Level Group-We meet from 7-8:30 at the Lighthouse Chapel every Thursday night. This is an open meeting and all are welcome. We do ask if you are not an alcoholic that you please do not share. Usually 20-25 each week with a great mix of sobriety time. We celebrate birthdays the last Thursday of the month.

We meet at Trinity Christian Church, 6400 W Walnut, Rm 10 and have 15-30 women in attendance, from seasoned members to newcomers.

**Stella T - Women's Changes-** This is an open women's meeting each Tuesday evening at 7 pm at the Church of the Nazarene, 2005 W Olive St. in the Hope Room. This is a 1 hour meeting. A chairperson reads from AA approved materials and shares from their personal experience as it relates to the reading. The meeting is then open for discussion. Our business meeting is held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month during the final 15 min of the regular meeting. We celebrate AA birthdays on the last Tuesday of the month with either a potluck or a restaurant gathering before the meeting. Cake is served following the birthday mtg.

Barbara B – Bridge Street Drunks Only-Bridge Street has 21 meetings a week & a 5:30 Women's Meeting on Mon. We use the Reflections in the AM and Noon meetings. We have 12 Steps & 12 Tradition Meeting on Wed and on Tues a Big Book Study. Thursday is a primary purpose group. We read Chapter 5 & 12 Traditions at the beginning with the reading of the Daily Reflections or any other approved AA literature. We then go around thee room for everyone to have a chance to talk. 
