Tradition Twelve

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all of our traditions. After all of the thought and discussion leading to the confirmation of the traditions, our founders believed that they must declare themselves humble, sober members and not apostles. We are continuously reminded of the depth of this concept at meetings, book studies, and group discussions after so many years and so many readings.

Some program people attach the spirit of anonymity to protection of individual identities and in deference to their private lives, pursuits and family members, we do not reveal our membership or the membership of others in a casual manner. It's not about secrecy or shame, but it may not be in the best interest of Alcoholics Anonymous or its friends to shout out to the world our standing in AA. It's probably better that I do not proclaim my attendance no matter how miraculous that is or how grateful I am to be one of us, and that I am better off in a spiritual sense if I keep this part of my life to myself. My boss, unless he is on my amends list, probably doesn't need to know of my membership or standing in Alcoholics Anonymous. Outside of my immediate family, I think it wise not setting myself up for judgemental folks because I may or may not conduct myself in a way that reflects, on a daily basis, that which might be expected of me by those outside the program.

A member told me that he avoided bumper stickers or placards with the AA logo because he thought he didn't always "drive an AA program". As a member I have a responsibility to compliment our beloved program and sometimes my actions are not complimentary. For the good of AA, it is probably better if our full names, and especially those of others should be kept between members. Some of us might be in life situations which could suffer if their clients or

patients knew of their attendance at AA. So it is a deference, a courtesy we pay, to cover for one another.

All of this has very little to do with the spirit of anonymity. That which is identified in the Twelfth Tradition is an example of humility. When members crow about their association in the program they set themselves up for comparison and criticism that reflects on all others who are trying to stay sober. When we see ourselves as being more spiritual, knowledgeable, effective or in higher standing then the result is scorn in the eyes of some. This often affects new members, prospects and the public at large if, after setting ourselves up as icons, we fail at some level. Those who attract attention to themselves all too often fail in the limelight and reduce the effectiveness of Alcoholics Anonymous.

We might examine a colony of bees, ultimately anonymous, the workers tirelessly struggle for the benefit of the colony. None give any regard to their distinctions. None lay claim to any extraordinary skill or achievement. Neither do they claim any special entitlements or privileges. They do not boast of extended periods in the hive. They work, teach, encourage, and respect one another without any perception of distinction. Personality does not modify performance. As individuals, they are only effective in a suicidal way. Together they are a formidable unit. The bees work together for the common good, unconcerned with their standing among their fellows. We could take a lesson.

Step Twelve

There is so much work we do to finally arrive at the stage in our recovery where we have attained a degree of humility that allows us to serve others. That is the essence of a spiritual awakening. That goal of unselfishness is primary and as so often quoted, "You can't give away what you don't have." Confidence in our new skill and reverence in our duty to witness the program comes in its own time. There are many among us with an innate gift when it comes to face-to-face twelfth step work. Bill Wilson was one of them. He describes his style in the Big Book emphasizes the steps to the steps. His advice is to "lay out our tools" before the new man for his inspection without criticism and not in the form of a sermon but so that he might identify with a person trapped exactly where he'd been. If there is sufficient interest we might introduce our literature and invite the new man to a meeting.

It is not necessarily an universal gift, this ability to face the scourge of alcoholism without timidity. Some may prefer other areas of service to pave the path to sobriety. Attending meetings and listening to the newcomer builds his confidence and is vital. There are a myriad of service positions for which we can volunteer to fulfil our duty to step twelve.

Practicing the principles in all our affairs is probably the deepest part of this step. The real proof of our awakening is our performance in life's events. Sometimes we will be on a natural high if everything is going our way. We call that a "pink cloud" because no experienced sober person would ever promise a life without trial. It is a natural part of our existence that we experience both ends of the arc of life's pendulum. The manner in which these states are handled shows the depth of our conversion. Living an AA life, guided by the will of a higher power is the fulfillment of the twelfth step.







tions given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.




Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.
