"Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on A. A. unity."

We stay together or the whole thing dies. That is right out to the Twelve and Twelve. The vitality of our movement is dependent on the groups and their members. The group is the power over our individual powerlessness. We survive together or collapse alone.

This is not because the individual has no importance. We are nourished by each member, no matter how long he or she has been sober. We fulfill one part of our twelfth step obligation through group meetings. It is often said that new people are the lifeblood of AA and that's generally true, but the group is the heart that circulates this spiritual nutrition.

This common welfare is sacrosanct and although we have freedom to attend where we like, freedom to disagree on some matters, freedom to express ourselves even at a profane level and freedom to seek change through group conscience, those freedoms are not without limit. If a member acts or reacts in a manner which hurts the group, he or she may be asked to attend elsewhere. Tradition one protects us from those who might threaten members, damage or abuse our meeting place or those who might attract unwanted attention from our community. We are not

obligated to any individual who cannot or does not respect or protect the best interest of our group. We must consult our consciences carefully, but no group should suffer extinction at the hands of an uncaring, unaware or unsound member.

It's the moment I stop pretending I have it together and acknowledge that my way hasn't worked, no matter how hard I tried or how good my intentions were. For me, this step is about humility and honesty: recognizing that alcohol eventually takes the driver's seat and my life becomes unmanageable in ways I can't ignore anymore. Step 1 isn't about weakness; it's about clarity. It's the foundation that opens the door to real change by admitting I need help beyond my own willpower.

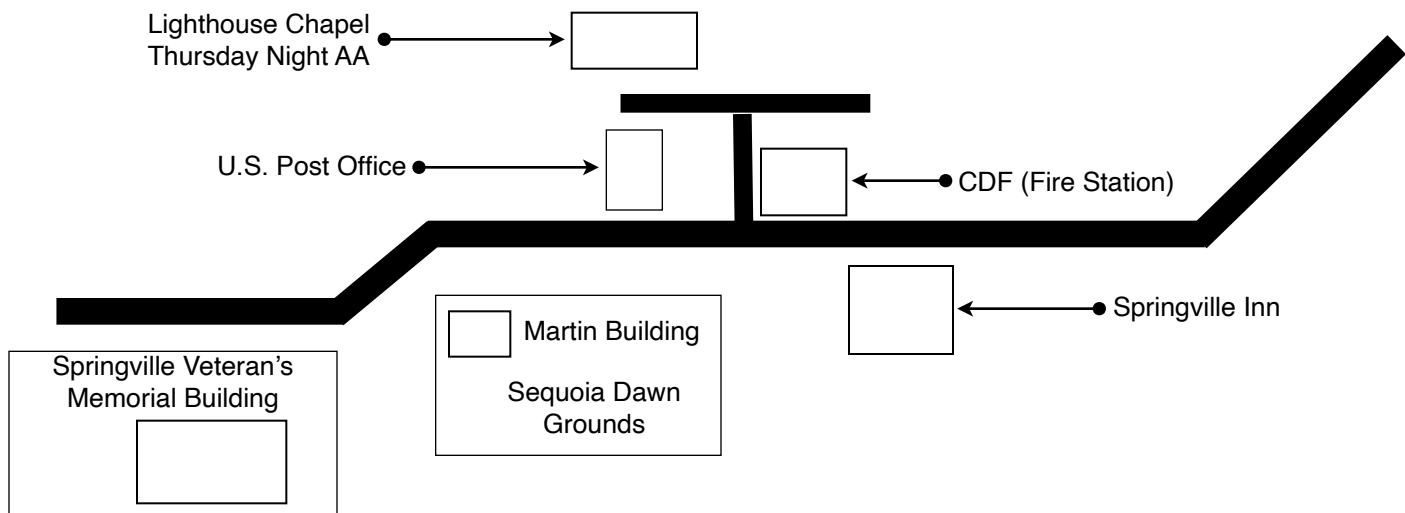
